# Celebration of EPIPHANY in Poland Feast of Three Kings

It is the beautiful custom in Poland to celebrate the Epiphany by using chalk and incense blessed by the priest. The chalk is used to mark the main doorposts of home, church, school, etc. with the following inscription which includes the new year and the first initials of the Wise Men, i.e., "K" Kaspar, "M" Melchior and "B" Balthazar:

## +20+K+M+B+10+

The incense grains are safely burned over charcoal or some heat source while prayers are invoked for blessings in the new year through the intercession of the Magi, or Three Kings.

Formerly, in many parishes the resident priest(s) would visit the homes of every parishioner on Epiphany and perform this traditional blessing with the incense and chalk. This would also be the opportunity to conduct a census of the number of parishioners. The priest(s) would be accompanied by the parish organist who would bring a calendar for each home visited.

#### "Making Better Use of Time"

*Happy New Year!* Perhaps some of us will be making the resolution to find more time in this brand new year, and that would be a noble pursuit and goal. Our contemporary world is so busy, and there are few of us not caught up in the whirlwind. Our days seem to be filled with things to do from the moment we get out of bed in the morning until it's time to go to sleep at night. We are pressed to find time for healthy leisure. The odd thing is that all our conveniences of life were supposed to permit that.

We have only to take a brief look at the ways things were a century ago to realize that we have come a long way from our forebears. First, some perspectives from 1910: **Pope (later Saint) Pius X** was on the Throne of Peter; **William Howard Taft** was President of the U.S.; **George V** became King of England after the death of King Edward VII; **Nicholas II** was ruling as the last czar before the Russian revolution; **Our Blessed Mother Mary** had not yet appeared to the children in Fatima.

Major contrasts between then and now: In autumn 1910, the Wright brothers tested an airplane for commercial flight, but the steamship remained the way to cross the Atlantic. The hull of *R.M.S. Olympic* (elder sister of the ill-fated *Titanic*) launched in Belfast. The automobile as we know it was still in its infancy. It was too costly for most, and feared by many. Horse and carriage, trolley, and train continued to be the choices for travel. Locally, the ill-fated Hampden Railroad, a rail connection between Springfield and Bondsville for train service to/from Boston would begin construction. Telephone service was limited, as was electricity. There were no radios, televisions, or computers.

People certainly worked a lot harder a century ago, mainly because most of the technological means to lighten tasks were yet to be invented. *But they still had more time than us.* At day's end, they could sit down at the table for an unhurried meal. While travel took longer, they could read or relax in that carriage or on the train. Most things quieted on weekends, and they would enjoy simply *sitting* after Sunday church services.

Fast forward on century: lights at the flick of a switch, furnaces, air conditioners, TVs, microwaves, DVDs, ATM machines, Internet, faster cars, air flights, cell phones, emails, texting....the list goes on. And we STILL complain we don't have enough time!

An old saying goes, "Good things come to those who wait." It took a long time for the **Three Kings** to come and pay homage to the newborn **Savior**. They didn't find Him on Christmas night. Jesus may have been a baby of one or two when they found Him. But they set their minds to the task at hand and persevered. Maybe that's why we still complain we have so little time: we don't know how to (or don't want to) persevere. When we want things instantly we never practice patience or acquire perseverance (how many are in anguish when a favorite web-site is not up and running in under a minute?!)

A resolution suggestion for this new year: First ask, "What is my real hurry? Where am I going?" (hint: our main destination is heaven. The way to get there is not by rushing, but persevering in a good Christian life). Second, quit the "rat race." **Just slow down**, even if it's a moment here or there through the day. It will make a difference. You will re-discover patience, fine tune the art of perseverance, and be a happier person.
