### “Dignity of the Poor & Vulnerable.”

**August 26, 2010** marks the 100th anniversary of the birth of Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu in Macedonia. Most of the world knows her as **Mother Teresa of Calcutta**.

At age 17, Agnes joined the Sisters of Loretto, a congregation known for its missionary work in India, and received her religious name in honor of St. Therese of Lisieux. In Calcutta, Sister Teresa taught high school religion and geography. After contracting tuberculosis, she was sent for recuperation. While on a train to Darjeeling, she received her “call within a call,” that of working and living directly with the poor. Some of her former students joined her, and after receiving Vatican permission, Sister Teresa became the Mother Foundress of a new religious community, the **Missionaries of Charity**, in 1950. The first Home for the Dying was opened in 1952. From the original number of twelve, Mother Teresa’s congregation grew to number in the thousands, serving “*the poorest of the poor*” and assisting persons to die in dignity. Among 450 centers around the world, the first U.S. home opened in the South Bronx in 1971.

Mother Teresa labored selflessly for nearly fifty years, winning the admiration of most of the world. She received numerous accolades, including the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. She accepted it on condition that the funds were used for the poor in Calcutta.

Over the years, Mother Teresa met with many world figures, including both **Popes Paul VI and John Paul II** who knew her well. Yet she considered the simple, poor, and outcast people as no less important, for in each of them she truly saw the face of Jesus. Mother knew that daily Mass and prayer before the Holy Eucharist, together with her Sisters, were the essential “powerhouse” that enabled, *indeed continues to enable*, their ministry to continue. After decades of love, dedication and service to God and her fellow man, her earthly life came to a close on September 5, 1997.

**Venerable John Paul II** dispensed with the customary five year wait after the death of one considered holy, and permitted the cause for her beatification to begin soon after her death. She was beatified by the late Pontiff on October 19, 2003.

While few could argue that Mother Teresa’s years as a religious Missionary of Charity were anything less than a tremendous gift and example, there are some critics and detractors. *Why?* Because Blessed Teresa so steadfastly proclaimed the dignity of human life, in every stage. Because as a champion of life, at the 1994 National Prayer Breakfast in the presence of former President Bill Clinton, she stated: “***Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love...the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion.***” Her defense of life---*which must be the position of every faithful practicing Catholic*, and indeed should be of every person of good will of other faiths or no faith---still causes those who selfishly promote the anti-life platforms of abortion, euthanasia, and embryonic stem cell destruction to react at her memory with anger and insult. Why else would the owners of the Empire State Building refuse to honor her in the centennial year of her birth by lighting that structure in her honor?

Thus, a century after her birth, Blessed Teresa of Calcutta continues to be a powerful symbol of the sanctity of life and an example of a faithful religious life.
