“Witness to Our Life in Eternity.”

On September 12th, Holy Mother Church observes the Feast of the **Holy Name of Mary**. After the **Most Holy Name of Our Lord Jesus**, Our Blessed Mother’s Name rightly deserves great honor. Our Lady’s Name carries such beauty and dignity, that it has been the practice of many religious communities that their members, upon entrance into the novitiate or at profession, receive the name of Mary as part of their complete name in religion. Doing so, they ask for the protection of Our Lady in their religious lives.

From the earliest times, persons have desired to follow Our Lord more closely in what has become known commonly as **religious life**, or a life of consecration to God. Female and male religious, those active (i.e., serving as priests (men), educators, nurses) and contemplative (e.g., cloistered nuns, monks) have been and continue to be a wonderful gift and necessary component to the Church and society in general.

Just as it takes some extra study and preparation to understand the structure of military life or the details in major league baseball, it’s beneficial to learn more about the intricacies and nuances of religious life. The majority of lay persons, including many secular (diocesan) clergy know only the bare minimum about life as a consecrated religious, and much of that scant information is often incomplete or completely mistaken.

For example, most people have an immediate image when they heard the word, “nun,” although many in the younger generation today have a far worse understanding due to the diminished numbers of religious sisters and their lack of identifiable garb in public. Still, the average person usually has a basic grasp of what a nun is. Yet far more vague is a person’s understanding of a religious brother. Even though a brother is essentially the male equivalent of a religious sister, many people erroneously believe that one who consecrates his life as a brother is either a) progressing toward the priesthood, or b) someone who just couldn’t make the grade as a priest and is “stuck” being a brother. Some religious communities don’t help in the understanding of a brother when they insist on placing the adjective “lay” or “permanent” before the brother’s title.

Priests, particularly secular clergy, and sisters have never been addressed as “permanent father” or “permanent sister.” It’s understood that their vocation is full and complete. So it is for the man who dedicates his life as a religious brother (fulfilled in any number of apostolic works: teacher, nurse, contemplative, pastoral assistant, laborer, etc.). His vocation is also full and complete. The terms “permanent brother” and “lay brother” (the latter is a contradiction) should be avoided and ultimately forgotten.

Priests, diocesan or religious, are part of the clerical state. While religious brothers and sisters are technically, according to current Canon Law, part of the lay faithful, they are set apart due to their profession of public vows. A sister or brother isn’t “better” than a lay person, but she/he is living a special consecration in dedication to the Lord through the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Their lifestyle now is a foreshadowing of the future existence of what each of us will enjoy in eternity.

Religious life is not irrelevant in the 21st century, and its witness value may be greater than ever before in a world full of superficiality and one often devoid of meaning.
