## “A Different Form of Service.”

In last week’s column, we spoke of the great gift of **religious life** to the Church and society at large. We continue exploring this topic.

The vast majority of the Catholic faithful are counted among the laity. Then there are those men who have been called to the Sacrament of Holy Orders and become part of the clergy. These are bishops, priests, and deacons (transitional, i.e., *those advancing to the priesthood*, and permanent). Another group of the faithful are those who consecrate themselves in a special way to God by professing the vows of **poverty, chastity and obedience**. These men and women are generally referred to as members of religious orders and these may be priests, sisters, or brothers.

Let us consider Our Lord’s words to the rich young man after He asked Jesus what he needed to do to gain eternal life. Our Lord’s response was not just for that young man, but for all of the baptized: **“If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you have, and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me.”** (cf.: **Matthew 19:21**) The laity (married, single, widowed, etc.) should try to follow Our Lord’s admonition as best suited to their state in life. But very few lay persons can live out our Lord’s recommendation radically. The one who is called to consecrated religious life, however, is called to do so in a more dedicated, intense lifestyle.

It’s important to remember that those who live as religious brothers, sisters, and priests are no better (or worse) than a lay person. In his First Epistle to the Corinthians, **Saint Paul** writes that **“there are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord.”** (cf.: **I Cor. 12:4-5**) The consecrated religious, therefore, is living a *different* life. Everything he/she does has its primary focus in God. Every apostolic work of the institute (active or contemplative) should be performed for the glory of God from which flows forth the good of His people.

We know that not everyone can be the boss. Growing up, sometimes we learn that lesson the hard way. It’s a fact that some persons by a gift from God are better suited to lead than others (this doesn’t mean that sometimes individuals who become leaders deserve that place!). Among those who lead on the local, national and international levels include city or town council members, police, principals, teachers, physicians, company presidents, managers, supervisors, congressmen, senators, presidents, prime ministers, even, unfortunately, dictators.

As is the case among the laity, within the clergy and religious some are called to serve as leaders. Among these are the pope, cardinals, bishops, pastors, superiors general, provincials, abbots, abbesses, directors of formation and vocations, school presidents, educators, and medical workers.

The crucial element for any leader, lay, clergy or religious is **service**. Due to human weakness, attitudes of grandeur, and personal insecurities, too often leaders allow selfish ambitions and desires to usurp their primary function which is to serve. Such distortions and corruptions have no place in a life of service.

Next week we will elaborate on the formation process of religious.
