### “Service at the Altar.”

Cooler temperatures and the changing autumn leaves with their eventual shedding signal the end of the warmth and green hues of summer. But autumn is also a time of beginning, i.e., a new school year. With that in mind, it’s appropriate to refresh and renew the duties of those who minister at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, namely **altar servers**. Just as their service is important, so is the manner in which they carry out their duties. To serve at the altar is no ordinary “job,” nor is it a theatrical performance. Service at the altar should always be **sacred and serious** for the altar server is privileged to be as close to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament as the priest.

One who carried out his duties in a sacred, serious manner was a young man named **Tarsicius** (feast day: August 15). He is one of the patron saints of altar servers and first communicants. Not much is known about Tarsicius, who lived and died during the persecutions of the Church that occurred between the middle of the third century to the beginning of the fourth. The little information we have about him is reliable and comes from a poem written about Tarsicius by **Pope St. Damasus I**. In it, the pope compares Tarsicius to St. Stephen, deacon and first martyr of the Church, stoned to death by an angry mob (cf.: Acts 6:1-7:60). Tarsicius may have been a deacon, although more probably he was an acolyte, i.e., one who serves at the altar. Similarly, Tarsicius’ love for the Holy Eucharist was so great that he gave his life for the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Tarsicius was killed rather *“than surrender the Sacred Body [of Christ] to the raging dogs.”* (St. Damasus, c. 305-384) One day, while carrying the Blessed Sacrament, perhaps for the sick, Tarsicius encountered a group of pagan youth. First, they tried to make him reject his Christian faith. When they noticed Tarsicius carrying something and guarding it closely, they tried to steal it from him for the purpose of desecration. With all his strength, Tarsicius fought them off to protect the Holy Eucharist, but he was outnumbered and lost his battle. Tarsicius was buried in the Catacombs of St. Callistus with the poetic inscription by St. Damasus engraved on his tomb.

The defense of, and love shown for the Holy Eucharist by St. Tarsicius is an example and inspiration for every altar server. Therefore **the external, reverent actions of the server should always be a reflection of his/her inner, proper disposition.**

Whether assisting at Holy Mass or other devotions (e.g., Benediction, 40 Hours, Stations of the Cross, etc.), the loyal server’s duties in the sanctuary require a change of attitude: altar service is not school time, sports, or hanging out with friends. Nor is he/she there as the center of attention. **The best server is the one whose assistance at the altar is barely noticed by the congregation and is never a distraction** for fellow servers or the faithful. And so, giggling and fidgeting are inappropriate while serving.

Processing reverently, standing straight, kneeling without slouching, responding clearly, hands folded in prayer all remind the congregation that **we are first and foremost worshipping God**. Eyes focused on the action at the altar, *especially at the solemn moment of Consecration*, are the right indication that the server fulfills his/her duties not for personal attention or praise, but for the greater glory of God.
