“The Main Choice Is Ignored.”

The study of consumer patterns over the last half century tells us that we have become a nation that is easily bored. Capitalizing on this, the consumer industry has exploited our boredom by offering us CHOICE. It has tapped into the human psyche to make us believe that “*New (choice) = Better.*” A wise person knows this isn’t always true.

Some may recall that in our area before 1970 there were generally three or four television stations from which to choose, i.e., channels 3 (Hartford), 22, 40, and 57 (Springfield), *FREE* of charge. If one had a particularly powerful TV antenna, or was situated in the right location, one might be able to receive a channel from farther east (Boston) or west (New York state). Then, in the late 1960s, a company called Pioneer Valley Cablevision arrived and offered 13 channels! Yes, one had to pay for this, but the monthly bill was only \$6.00! (*Have you checked your cable or satellite bill lately?*)

A mere forty years ago, the names Comcast, Charter, DIRECTV, and the Dish Network were unknown. Today, each of these offers their subscribers a choice of hundreds of TV stations. While the monthly invoice has skyrocketed, how many of those channels do we actually watch, or even find useful? Thirteen, five,.....*less?*

Accusations of monopoly doomed the original American Telephone & Telegraph, a/k/a “Ma Bell.” Once other companies competed in the phone business, the consumer would have more choice and lower phone bills (*are you laughing yet?*). So the best functioning telephone company in the world---where one call would provide the phone, connection, service, and repairs----was dismantled. The same move has been made with the electric companies, though the public has shown far less desire for choice.

The examples of the choices we face are nearly numberless and include the snack and beverage industries. The venerable Oreo cookie is now “dressed up” in various coatings, colors, even shapes (*Have you tried the “football” Oreos?*).

Gone are the days of June and Ward Cleaver discussing the Beaver and Wally over a plain cup of coffee (with or without cream and sugar). Many have become familiar with coffee manufacturers which provide individual “coffee cups,” enabling the consumer to choose coffee and tea from an amazing number of flavor choices.

Aren’t we overwhelmed, just a bit, when we walk into those giant “big box” stores and gaze on the sheer number of products rising from floor to ceiling, aisle after aisle? Don’t we feel a tiny desire for a Faulkner’s, W.T. Grant, or the Village Dairy Bar?

There’s nothing inherently wrong with choices. But when we allow them to multiply to the point of the absurd (*How? We continue to purchase them, right?*), then who’s really making the choice? Some are finding that maybe a well-brewed pot of plain old coffee isn’t that “boring” after all. Maybe I like my ginger ale to taste like ginger ale, not raspberry or lemon flavored. Perhaps that plain cracker or pretzel is just fine after all.

“*You have made us for Yourself, O Lord,*” said **St. Augustine of Hippo** centuries ago, “*and our hearts are restless, until they rest in You.*” Changes and choices will never fully substitute for or satisfy what is the innermost longing of man: **God**. He, unfortunately, is the main choice Who is excluded by too many today.
