# "Our Lady, the Rosary, & Eternity."

The month of October is dedicated to **Our Lady of the Rosary**. From the moment Our Lord Jesus entrusted Our Blessed Mother Mary to the care of Saint John the Apostle at the foot of the Cross, Our Lady became the mother of all humanity. She continues to care for each one of us, taking our prayers and concerns to her Son. Our Lord, in turn, never refuses, in accord with His divine will, whatever she asks of Him.

Our Blessed Mother has shown her concern for us in her numerous visits throughout history. In her apparitions, Mary has consistently called for prayer, fasting, and repentance. She has done so by promoting the prayer of the Holy Rosary.

From its inception, the Holy Rosary has been divided into three "mysteries" or events in the lives of Our Lord and Our Lady. The *Our Father* is prayed at the start of each of five decades of *Hail Marys* in the **joyful, sorrowful**, and **glorious** mysteries. The 150 *Hail Marys* of the original three mysteries corresponded to the 150 psalms. This was especially helpful when few could read the Holy Bible. Recently, the late beloved **Venerable Pope John Paul II** (1920-2005) added a fourth "mystery," that of the **luminous**, or mysteries of light, which fits perfectly between the joyful and sorrowful.

As the Church's liturgical year grows shorter, the themes in the Holy Mass and Divine Office turn more toward endings: the end of our human life, a fact that cannot be avoided by any person; and the end of the world. Since Christ's coming in history, we are, in fact, in the "end times." (cf.: **Galatians 4:3-7ff.**) Yet many prefer to ignore these truths, perhaps out of human fear or even denial. As Christians, we need to face the inevitability of death, not with hopeless fear, but in joyful expectation. It is also to our benefit to stop postponing or ignoring what we must do to attain the Eternal Kingdom.

In her appearances, e.g., Lourdes, LaSalette, Fatima, Our Blessed Mother helps us to focus on the fact that our life here is temporary. It's truly a pilgrimage, and she wants us to stay on the right path to achieve the destination Our Lord desires for each of us: eternal joy with Him in Heaven. But He doesn't force anyone. It's up to each of us.

Pray the rosary often as this month continues. But don't pray it only in October or May. Try to pray it every day. It is a powerful, scriptural meditation. We offer the following prayer to Our Lady of Sorrows (whose feast we celebrate on Sept. 15):

O Mother of Sorrows, by the anguish and love with which thou didst stand at the Cross of Jesus, stand by me in my last agony. To thy maternal heart I commend the last three hours of my life. Offer these hours to the Eternal Father in union with the agony of our dearest Lord in atonement for my sins. Offer to the Eternal Father the most Precious Blood of Jesus, mingled with your tears on Calvary, that I may obtain the grace of receiving Holy Communion with the most perfect love and contrition before my death, and that I may breathe forth my soul in the adorable presence of Jesus. Dearest Mother, when the moment of my death has at length come, present me as your child to Jesus. Ask Him to forgive me for having offended Him for I know not what I did. Beg Him to receive me into His Kingdom of glory to be united with Him forever. Amen.
