Living in A Violent World

The shooting rampage by a lone and apparently crazed individual in Arizona on Jan. 8, resulting in six deaths and numerous other injuries is an incident that has been added to a growing list of similar tragedies. While we may have become accustomed to hearing about violence around the world, such as the continuing attacks on Christians in the Middle East (witness the attack on Coptic Christians worshipping in an Egyptian church on New Year's Day 2011---killing over 20 and injuring 100s---which **Pope Benedict** decried as "despicable acts of death" which offend God), this type of violence in the United States, unprecedented to earlier generations, continues to escalate.

The causes of such tragedies are complex and numerous. Some of the incidents do indeed originate in the disturbed mind of an individual or group. Others are calculated by terrorists, intent on destruction. Still others occur as deadly "copy-cat" crimes.

Sadly, these violent acts include persons of all ages and backgrounds. Though they may have begun earlier, we can trace some of the most recent of these back to Columbine High School where two male students went on a murderous and ultimately suicidal rampage in 1999. We have heard of children killing parents, parents murdering their children. Educational institutions are not immune with violence taking place on campuses like Virginia Tech (2007). The terrorist attacks of September 11th, 2001 are the pinnacle of such perpetrations of violence. In fact, there have been so many violent acts in this country that we as a people may have become indifferent to their occurrence. Indifferent, that is, until the latest act of violence. With each new attack, we come together, rightly decry the senselessness and waste of life, and determine to do better as individuals and as a nation. We are fighting no war within our country, yet blood continues to be shed. Too many innocent people are caught up in a seemingly relentless carnage of our dangerous times. *Or are we in a war?* A war between good and evil?

Since its birth over two centuries ago, the United States has been a nation blessed by the Lord in numerous ways. Our founding fathers recognized the benevolence of God. We have prospered as "one nation, under God." Yet those very words in the Pledge of Allegiance are despised today by a vocal minority seeking to remove any mention of God in the public. Can we expect His blessings if we reject Him?

Perhaps we may go back to the early 1960s, when praying in public schools was deemed to be unconstitutional. Where precisely does it say in the U.S. Constitution that one may not pray in a public building? Certainly we can look back to the legally flawed U.S. Supreme Court decision to legalize abortion in 1973 as the start of our nation's slow disintegration for the sanctity of all life. If we support the notion that the beginning of new life in the womb is disposable, why should the other phases of life be deemed valuable?

If it is not obvious to any person by now, we need to be regularly on our knees, imploring Almighty God for His forgiveness and **Divine Mercy**. As Catholics, the more time we spend with Him in the Eucharist will only assist this nation to get back on track---before we are so far off the good and moral route that a deadly crash is unavoidable.
