## In Prayer We Are Never Alone

We have been discussing the need for prayer in the life of every Christian. We should state here that, though more often than not we pray by ourselves, prayer is not something we do alone. Each time we pray, whether in the privacy of our room or at church, we do so in union with God and our fellow Christians. The fact that prayer must be a dialogue tells us that it is never an isolated act. Prayer, therefore, is both individual and communal. We may pray in solitude, but we do so within the unity of believers.

**Pope Benedict XVI** recently touched on this theme during his weekly general audience at the Vatican. *“Christian prayer, participation in Jesus’ prayer is par excellence a filial experience, as attested to us in the words of the Our Father, prayer of the family – the ‘we’ of the children of God...Only in the ‘we’ can we say the Our Father.” (Jan. 19, 2011).*

The best example of communal prayer for Catholics, of course, is the **Holy Mass**, the Eucharistic Sacrifice. We are invited to participate, if not daily, at least once a week on the Lord’s Day, i.e., Sunday or Saturday Vigil. Whether conscious of it or not, there are **four main reasons** a person comes to Mass: **to adore, to thank, to seek forgiveness from God, and to petition** (ask favors) from Him.

The first of these, adoration or worship, is the principal reason we gather to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Though we can never repay Him, how can a believer not want to offer his/her worship to God for the redeeming death of His only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ on the Cross? Our full participation at Mass permits us to express our gratitude in joyful worship of the God Who created and saved us.

Some mistakenly think that *full participation* means we must be active or busy, e.g., functioning as a lector, extraordinary minister, server, usher, etc. But participation is first and foremost interior. With mind and heart focused at Mass, then our full attention, response, singing, reception of Communion (without mortal sin), etc. *is* participation.

Our proper and reverent posture is also participation. We do so in three ways during Mass: standing, sitting, and kneeling. Here we address the latter.

In a recent article, Fr. Andreas Hoeck, academic dean at St. John Vianney Seminary, Denver, wrote on liturgical gestures and postures. We focus here on kneeling, since that posture is so identifiable with prayer: *“The kneeling posture was introduced in the liturgy principally as a sign of humble supplication, sorrow, and penance.*

*“In the course of time **kneeling** became more and more a sign of profound adoration, and this is now its predominant meaning during the Eucharistic Prayer and the consecration of the Blessed Sacrament, as well as for the adoration of the Cross.”*

*“For individual prayer, [kneeling] is the prevalent posture. It also emphasizes the silent prayer of the community.”* {Homiletic & Pastoral Review, Nov. 2010, pp.48-53}

Thus, in our words--aloud or in the silence of our hearts--with others or alone with the Lord, and in our bodily posture do we fittingly enter into dialogue with the Lord in prayer. Finally, let us remember, too, that prayer demands *listening* on our part!
