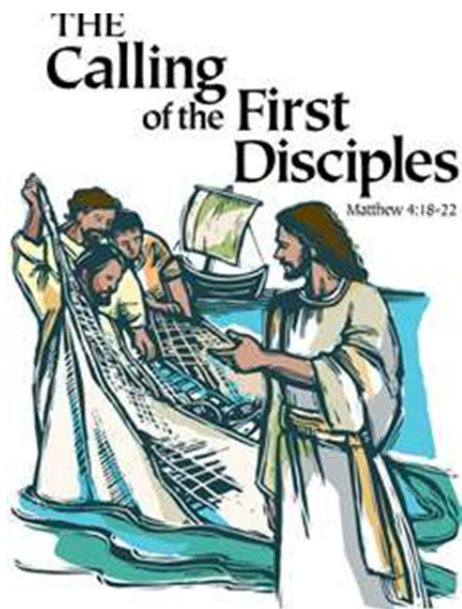

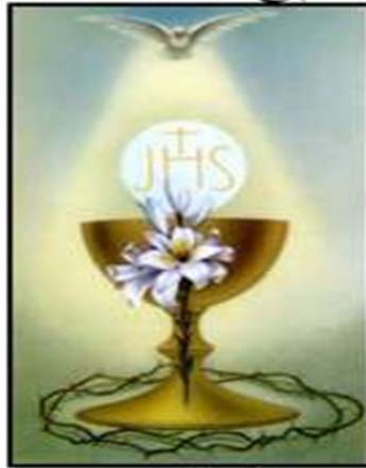

# FIFTY QUESTIONS ON THE ORDER OF MASS

A Brief Examination of Practice

These brief reflections are about developing good habits. Habits of fidelity to the liturgical books of the Roman Rite. They are based upon a conviction that only through fidelity to the Church's liturgical texts and rites can we bring about an effective *Ars Celebrandi*, an art of celebrating the sacred liturgy with authenticity.

## THE COMMUNION RITE...continued

### #45 ~ Is there a prayer to be prayed while purifying the chalice?

Yes. While the priest purifies the paten and chalice, he prays: "What has passed our lips as food, O Lord..."

### #46 ~ Who can purify sacred vessels?

"The sacred vessels are purified by the Priest, the Deacon, or an instituted acolyte." Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are not authorized to purify the sacred vessels.

## CONCLUDING RITES

### #47 ~ Where does the priest stand for the Prayer After Communion?

The priest may pray these concluding rites from the altar or at the chair.

### #48 ~ May pastoral announcements be made after the homily?

No. Brief announcements are provided for only after the Prayer after Communion.

### #49 ~ May Mass ever be celebrated without at least a server present?

Mass may be celebrated by the priest alone "for a just and reasonable cause....In this case, the greetings, the instructions, and the blessing at the end of Mass are omitted."

### #50 ~ Should Holy Communion be regularly distributed from the tabernacle?"

"It is most desirable that the faithful...receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass...so that even my means of the signs Communion may stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated."

### "THE SON"

A wealthy man and his son loved to collect rare works of art. They had everything in their collection, from Picasso to Raphael. They would often sit together and admire the great works of art. When the Vietnam conflict broke out, the son went to war. He was very courageous and died in battle while rescuing another soldier. The father was notified and grieved deeply for his only son. About a month later, just before Christmas, there was a knock at the door. A young man stood at the door with a large package in his hands. He said, 'Sir, you don't know me, but I am the soldier for whom your son gave his life, he was carrying me to safety when a bullet struck him in the heart and he died instantly... He often talked about you, and your love for art.' The young man held out this package. 'I know this isn't much. I'm not really a great artist, but I think your son would have wanted you to have this.' The father opened the package. It was a portrait of his son, painted by the young man. He stared in awe at the way the soldier had captured the personality of his son in the painting. The father was so drawn to the eyes that his own eyes welled up with tears.
